Mayor's Corner

Hello South Weber Residents,

You may have noticed a change in the look of the landfill along the northern perimeter. Wasatch Integrated Waste Management District (WIWMD) has installed a final liner along the sloped perimeter; it will be covered with 3 feet of soil and then seeded. WIWMD has done this portion of the final cover before the phase has been completed with the hope that odor in South Weber City will be reduced; and overall, it seems to be making a difference.

Wasatch Integrated is also in the process of building a transfer/ sorting station. All plastics (with or without a number) will be sorted and taken to Geocycle, a cement plant in Croydon, to be used as engineered fuel for running the plant. Wasatch Integrated will also

provide the plant with shredded mattresses for the same purpose; the landfill receives about 100 mattresses/day. Finally, green waste will be transported to Wasatch Resource Recovery (South Davis Sewer District) for anaerobic digestion to produce renewable natural gas and carbon-based fertilizer. This is a huge step toward improving our environment through recycling. WIWMD is constantly looking for new and better ways to reduce and reuse our waste.

Last month I presented an initiative to the Utah Transportation Commission to replace the US-89 bridges over the Weber River with next summer's construction project on US-89. Though the UDOT Structures Division recommends these bridges be replaced, UDOT does not currently have the funding for that scope of project. This initiative works to ensure that those bridges will have the funding to be replaced. UDOT has already stated that they will lengthen those bridges when they are replaced to accommodate a trail underneath. This improvement will ultimately connect the Bonneville Shoreline Trail to the Weber River Trail through South Weber City. South Weber City has the support of the Weber and Davis County Commissioners, the Wasatch Front Regional Council, Senators Adams and Milner, and the mayors of Davis County in pushing this initiative forward. We will work hard to complete this major regional trail system.

I hope you all enjoy my favorite time of the year!!!

As many know, the below normal snowpack produced less water than desired, and the irrigation season has been hot and dry. We all hoped for rainfall to assist in the water supply, but the area is in a drought condition. This creates higher water use from a limited supply. After discussions and coordination with Weber Basin and other water agencies, it has been decided to be prudent in planning for next year's water season. The 2018 irrigation season will end October 1st so that we can begin to save as much water as possible in storage for the 2019 water season.

We appreciate your understanding of this situation and timeline. We ask that you efficiently use the water wisely for the remainder of the time and be aware of the water situation. We hope that this upcoming winter will produce more snow than this past year, if not, reservoirs may not fill next spring.

Code Enforcement Notes

For the month of October, we are solely focusing on getting nuisance vehicles off all properties in South Weber. We will not immediately cite property owners, but notification will be made, and a specific date will be given to bring the property within compliance.

Please help us by starting your cleanup now so that we can all be good neighbors and enjoy the beauties that surround us. Our goal is to have all properties cleared of nuisance vehicles by April 1st, 2019. Please feel free to contact City Hall for any questions regarding code enforcement.

As fall approaches, many of us are focused on landscaping projects requiring a trip to the dump. The Davis County Landfill is open to all, but each resident has the responsibility to prove he/she resides in Davis County to receive significantly lower rates. Most Citizens can provide their state ID for this purpose. For the few residents who choose to have Ogden listed as their city of residence for mailing, the landfill recommends taking a City Utility Bill with you for validation of residency. If you do not have a bill, please drop by the city office and we can print one for you. Or you can find them online at www.xpressbillpay.com.

We had an evacuation last month because of a gas leak at the Elementary School. A lot of residents did not receive notification of the evacuation. Please remember that you can sign up for "Code Red" through the County. CodeRed is an emergency notification service by which public safety can notify registered residents and businesses by telephone or cellular phone about emergency situations. Fire Department

This last month we had a fire that was started by a minor. We would like to remind everyone that we do have a Juvenile Fire Setter Program.

The statewide program offers guidance and plans to parents as well as their children through trained firefighters throughout the state. These programs have been developed by psychologists, firefighters, and the burn unit at the U of U.

As we know, fire-play can be extremely dangerous in any situation. However, when fires are started by children, their fire-play may be just one of many complications at hand. After a child has been found to have started a fire, it may be required by fire officials or police officials that both parents and children meet to discuss the program.

If you find evidence of Fire-play in your home or on your property, we always encourage you to contact us. Let us help you prevent larger fires which could financially cause large setbacks for you.
