Code Enforcement Notes/A Message from the Fire Department

Please look and see the differences of closed doors versus opened doors. When Integrated Smoke Detectors and closing your doors are used together, this gives us the best chance to help you escape a fire.

Greetings South Weber Residents,

So far, it has been a light snow year; however, it is forecasted that snow is coming. The Sheriff's Office would like to again remind you that Winter Parking Restrictions are in effect to ensure that your streets are properly cleared of snow. The parking restrictions are as follows: **No on street parking between the hours of midnight and noon. A temporary parking permit may be issued through the City offices to residents or persons visiting, for emergencies, or other unusual circumstances with good cause shown.**

The Sheriff's Office Deputy/Paramedics have also seen an increase in respiratory distress calls this year often related to the significant outbreak of influenza. The number one way to prevent the spread of the flu virus begins with good hand washing. It's also not too late to get a flu shot, which has proven to be effective in preventing or limiting the virus. Last, if you do get sick with the flu, it's a good idea to stay home until you recover. You will get better faster and help prevent the spread of the virus. Take care of yourself because you are worth it.

The Sheriff's Office believes in a team approach in keeping our community safe. The watchful eyes and ears of our residents reporting suspicious activity in their neighborhoods is extremely beneficial to our Deputies. Winter Ordinance Reminders

We are anticipating some heavy snow storms in the next month. Here are a few guidelines on snow removal and keeping our city safe during these weather conditions.

Code 6.01.040 (D):

No on-street parking from 12 o'clock midnight until 12 o'clock noon from November 1st through March 31st.

Code 7.01.020 (A):

Keep sidewalks clear of snow, sleet, and hail.

Other reminders:

Slow down in the school zones and watch for children and buses, get the snow blowers and plows serviced, check rain gutters and fireplace chimneys, and clear off sidewalks and 3 feet around fire hydrants.

DON'T FORGET:

It is unlawful for any person to deposit or blow snow, or any other material, onto the street!
