Snow Removal

A friendly reminder that as the snow starts falling, it is against city code to move the snow from your property to someone else's or into the roadways. Our Public Works Department works hard to keep the roadways clear for emergency vehicles to make a safe response in case of a fire or a medical emergency. You never know when an emergency will happen in your home, so please have a clear path for our fire crews to operate their equipment up near your home.

Please keep your sidewalks clear, as well as any fire hydrants clear; if you have a property within South Weber City that is bordered by a sidewalk or that is next to a fire hydrant, it is your responsibility to keep it clear. As we receive complaints, we will first issue a documented verbal or written warning and then issue a citation. We understand that a little wind can make removing snow a never-ending process, but we hope that by working together, we can make all our sidewalks safe for residents who travel on them daily!

Are you a Business Owner?

Business License Renewal Forms have already been mailed out, so keep an eye out for them. Please have them signed and returned back to Kimberli with your payment as soon as possible. Payments are to be in the form of a check. All renewals are due back by December 31, 2021 and are considered late after that date. Please be aware that a 50% penalty will be assessed to the license fee for all license renewals that have not been paid by January 31, 2022, and a 100% penalty will be assessed to the fee for any business license renewal which is not paid by February 28, 2022.

Scheduling a fire inspection will work a little differently this year. On your renewal form, please indicate whether an AM or PM inspection works better for you. From there, Kimberli will contact you to schedule the actual inspection.

The city has stopped tracking and renewing business licenses for home businesses that do not have patrons coming inside the home, so if you have this kind of business, you will not be receiving a renewal form for 2022.
