## Code Enforcement

City Ordinance requires that all door-to-door solicitors register with the City. Once they are registered with the City, they are issued an ID Badge that includes their business license number, their name, company name and contact information, and a photo of the person. If a solicitor comes to your door and they do not have a badge, please refer them to the City.

If you have problems with a solicitor, please notify the Davis County Sheriff's Department via their Non-Emergency Phone Number: 801-444-2280. The City notifies the Davis County Sheriff's Department after each solicitor has registered. If you have questions regarding business licenses, please contact the City Office. If you have a "NO SOLICITING" sign, it MUST be honored.

## Call Before You Dig

Planning on doing some landscaping this year? 811 is the national call-before-you-dig phone number. Anyone who plans to dig should call 811 or go to our state's official 811 website [www.bluestakes.org/](http://www.bluestakes.org/) before digging to request that approximate location of buried utilities be marked with paint or flags so that you don't unintentionally dig into an underground utility line.

Before calling, please have the following ready:

- The address where you plan to dig—including the county and nearest cross street
- The type of project you're completing
- The exact area on the property where you're planning to dig.

## South Weber 2021 Election Notice

There will be a municipal general election on November 2, 2021 for the following offices:

Two At-Large City Council positions (4-year term)

Mayor (4-year term)

The constitutional and statutory qualification requirements for municipal office are:

The person is a registered voter in the municipality

The person will be at least 18 years old at the time of the next election

The person is a legal resident of the municipality for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.

The person has not been convicted of a felony

Interested parties may declare their candidacy for an office in person between June 1 and June 4 or June 7, 2021 at City Hall with the City Recorder located at 1600 E South Weber Dr. Between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm.

## What's Your Number?

Did you know that having numbers on your house and on the curb in front of your house are SUPER important for utility purposes as well as for emergency vehicles to respond quickly? When there is an issue with your utilities, it makes it easier for our public workers to find your address when there are visible house numbers up. First responders also need to locate your address quickly to assist you during an emergency.

Please make sure that your numbers are a minimum of 3 inches. They must be in a color that contrasts with the background. Make sure you have good lighting to illuminate your house numbers at night.
