## Mayor's Message

If you have been a fan of the Davis County Fair, you won't have to wait all summer to enjoy the activities. The name, date and place of the Fair have all changed.

The first ever Davis Heritage Festival will be held May 19 -21, 2022 at the Utah State University Botanical Center in Kaysville. Among the many activities will be horse rides, train rides, vendors, entertainment and the baby animals. These changes were made to create a more family-oriented, country atmosphere. New buildings and an indoor arena will be added in the future.

Just though you might be interested to know that we recently had a meeting with one of the gravel pits representatives (Geneva). They informed us of some changes they are making at their facility that they hope will make a noticeable difference in the dust coming from their operations. They are adding polymer to the water and also a clarifier which will extract the fine sand from the slurry. They are optimistic this will help.

# Davis Weber Water Canal Companies

We are grateful for the spring snow and rain, but we're still in a severe drought designation. Similar to last year, we will have water restrictions and end the water season early. The secondary water system startup was delayed by 2 weeks (pressurized during late April) and available by May 2nd.

Please reduce your secondary water use and limit watering to once a week until Memorial Day, twice a week from Memorial Day to Labor Day, and then back to once a week until the end of the water season. We do not recommend new landscapes under the circumstances. The secondary water system will be shut down October 1st or sooner, depending on water supplies and water use.

## WATERING SCHEDULE BETWEEN MEMORIAL DAY AND LABOR DAY:

- If your house number ends in:
- 0,1,2,3 - Water on Monday and Thursday
- 4,5,6 - Water on Tuesday and Friday
- 7,8,9 - Water on Wednesday and Saturday

We continue to encourage efficient use of the water and conserve where possible. Please adjust your watering based on the weather. Please strive to only water your yard based on its 'need'.

The State website (<http://www.conservewater.utah.gov/>) states "the typical Utah household will use twice as much water outside as necessary." We encourage all users to reference the State website for their weekly watering guide.

The State requires meters on all new secondary water services and recent legislation passed to have all secondary water systems to be fully metered by the end of 2029. We are sending water use reports to those with meters in an effort to better educate the end user and better manage our limited water resources, Please contact us ([meters@davisweber.org](mailto:meters@davisweber.org)) and provide an email address so the report can be sent to you monthly.

## Friendly Reminders

As the weather improves, please be aware of pedestrians and obey all local traffic signs.

Please keep pets on a leash at all times whether you are walking them at 5 am or 5 pm.

All sidewalks should be kept clear and unobstructed to a height of seven feet. No vegetation shall be allowed to extend into the street past the curb face of the edge of the pavement where there is no curb to a height of less than fourteen feet.

# Fire Department

As the weather warms up, we want to remind everyone of our guidelines for Recreational Fires.

Recreational Fires shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material. Conditions which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition.

Open burning/recreational fires shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher with a maximum 4-A rating or other approved onsite fire extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose, or water truck shall be available for immediate utilization.

Fire must not be larger than 3 ft in diameter. Burning material other than firewood, charcoal briquettes, propane or L.P. gas is prohibited. South Weber Fire Department reserves the right to order a fire to be extinguished at any time.

# Solicitors

It's that time of year - solicitors may or may not be knocking on your door as the weather warms up. Here are some things you should know:

1. Solicitors (those who are selling goods or services) are required by law to register with the City of South Weber, which issues them a badge. Some may skip this step and solicit illegally. Ask to see their city solicitor's badge - if they don't have one, they are in violation.
2. Solicitors are not allowed to knock on doors with "No Soliciting" signs.
3. Solicitation may only occur between 9:00 am and 9:00 pm.

If a solicitor violates one of these rules, you may contact the police to report them.
