## SPRING CLEAN UP

Let's get those yards in tip-top shape!! That's right, everyone! It's time for our Annual Spring Clean Up.

Get rid of all your tree trimmings, grass clippings, and dead leaves and bring them to Canyon Meadows Park on April 20 from 8 am to 2 pm.

### Restricted items include:



concrete

dirt

sod

rocks

manure

liquid waste

pesticides, chemicals

medical/hazardous waste

items longer than 10 ft.

Also, tires are not accepted



## Public Works Pointers

After a disaster or emergency, tap water may not be safe to use. Here are a few tips to make your water safe:

- Boil your water for one minute. This method will kill bacteria, viruses, and parasites.
- Add 8 drops or a little less than 1/8 of a teaspoon of 5%-9% unscented household bleach per 1 gallon of water. This method will kill most viruses and bacteria.
- Choose a water filter labeled to remove parasites, and follow the manufacturer's instructions. Filtered water might need additional treatment to be safe!

## WINTER PARKING

The Winter Parking Ordinance ended on March 31 for this winter, but considering our unpredictable weather patterns, if you encounter snow, please try to park off the street to allow our snowplows ample room!

## SECONDARY WATER

### South Weber Water Improvement District:

The South Weber Water Improvement District will be turning on its water systems starting on April 22. Please check their website at [southweberwater.com](http://southweberwater.com) for information on water scheduling.

### South Weber Irrigation:

South Weber Irrigation will be turning on its system starting on April 15. Please ensure all your valves are shut off within the first week of April so they can start filling their systems.

### WATERING DAYS

Even House Numbers: Monday, Wednesday, Friday

Odd House Numbers: Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday

No watering on Sundays

Water between the hours of 6 PM and 10 AM. This does not apply to parks and agriculture.

### Davis Weber Counties Canal Company:

Davis Weber Counties Canal Company will be turning on its water starting on April 15th.

### WATERING DAYS:

Houses ending in 0, 1, 2, 3: Mondays & Thursdays

Houses ending in 4, 5, 6: Tuesdays and Fridays

Houses ending in 7, 8, 9: Wednesdays and Saturdays

Water between the hours of 6 PM and 10 AM.

### Weber Basin Water:

Weber Basin Water will be turning its systems on starting on April 15th (weather permitting). Although there isn't a set schedule for watering days, please note that every house serviced by Weber Basin Water is now being metered. You can monitor your usage through their portal! If you do not know how to access your portal, contact Weber Basin at 801-771-1677.



## UTILITY RATE STUDIES

Approximately 7 years ago, we conducted a study on our water and sewer rates, as well as our Transportation Utility Fee. It is now time for us to revisit those rates and conduct another study on them!

### So what is a Utility Rate Study?

A utility rate study is conducted to help the City Council and City Staff understand the true cost of utility services. It assists in creating master plans and maintenance plans for all of our utility systems, including our Water Systems, Sewer Systems, and Transportation Utility services.

These plans outline the maintenance and upgrading of our systems at prescribed times to ensure that the city's utility systems are appropriately maintained and upgraded. This ensures that services continue to run smoothly for South Weber residents, both now and in the future.

### What does this mean for residents?

Nothing yet! We still need to complete the studies. However, once these studies are done, you may be notified of changes to your utility bill rates.

Our goal isn't to raise the rates; rather, it is to ensure we have enough funding to maintain our level of service. Any changes to the rate may result from increases in material, labor, and construction costs. However, the city's goal is always to be as efficient as possible with the utility fees received.

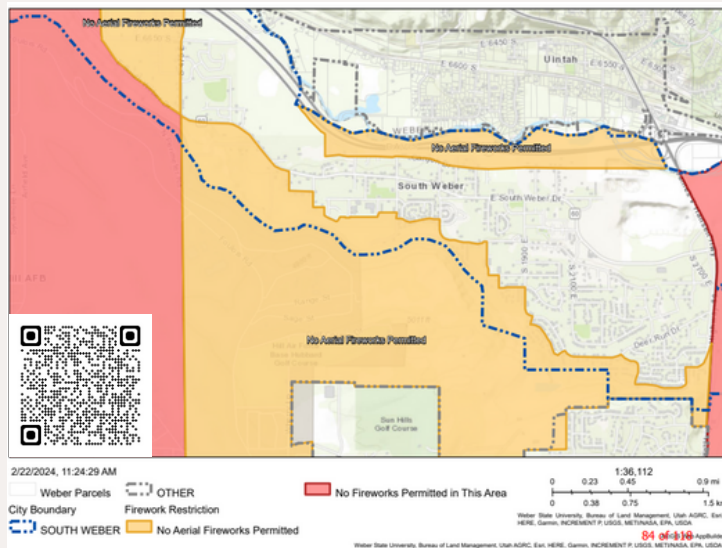

## NOTICE OF MAINTENANCE OF WEBER BASIN WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT FLUORIDE FACILITY

Weber Basin Water Conservancy District (District) owns and maintains the South Weber Fluoridation Facility located in South Weber, Utah. The facility injects fluoride into the drinking water supply which is delivered to South Weber City. Due to water system maintenance needs, power to the fluoride facility was disconnected in October 2023, and fluoride has not been dosed into the drinking water supply since that time.

The District is currently engaged in the refurbishment of critical electrical equipment required for operation of the fluoride facility. The District plans to re-establish power to the site to safely feed fluoride again to the drinking water delivered to South Weber City. It is anticipated that the fluoride facility will be returned to operation in October 2024.

Clear and visible house numbers are crucial for efficient emergency response by the fire department.

**To ensure your house numbers are easy to spot:**

- Use large, bold numbers that contrast with the background for optimal visibility.
- Consider installing reflective or illuminated numbers for enhanced visibility, especially at night.
- Regularly maintain and clean the numbers to prevent obstruction and maintain visibility.
- Position numbers near your front door and ensure they are unobstructed from the street view.

By following these simple guidelines, you contribute to a safer and more efficient emergency response in your community.

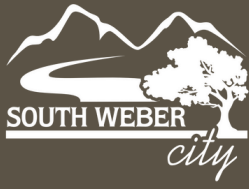
