SOLICITORS IN SOUTH WEBER

'Tis the season of solicitors, and we've got a few things for residents to look out for! The City has laws in place (Code 3-8) to protect citizens from unwelcomed solicitation. Keep in mind:

- The solicitor must have a South Weber City Soliciting Badge. A badge from another city or company does not mean they have been registered with the city or undergone a background check.
- "Just telling" residents about a service is still considered soliciting. Registration for that solicitor is required.
- If the solicitor says they are with Rocky Mountain Power or another utility company, residents can ask for documented proof and refuse to allow the solicitor into their home.
- There is no such thing as a "soliciting zone". If residents have a "no soliciting" sign, solicitors aren't supposed to knock.
- If you as a resident, feel threatened at any time, please call the police. The non-emergency line is 801-451-4150.

DO YOU NEED A SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT?

If your event is open to the public, it takes place within the City's right-of-way (such as streets, sidewalks, or public parks), has vendors, or amplified sound, you will need a Special Event Permit.

A special event is an event occurring out of the ordinary course of everyday functions. Special events may include, but are not limited to:

Block Parties

Carnivals or Circuses

Concerts or Performances

Craft or Trade Shows

Demonstrations/Rally

Farmer's Market (Street Fair/Festival)

Lectures

Outdoor Movie

Parades

Parking Lot Sales (if not held on your own property)

Races (Runs/Walks)

The permit process ensures that your event is safe, well-organized, and coordinated with necessary city departments.

South Weber City prides itself on the events, activities and celebrations that engage our community and enrich our quality of life. We look forward to reviewing your application, and if approved, working with you to make your event a success.

A MESSAGE FROM DWCCC

Below is a message shared by one of our 4 secondary water companies:

The spring runoff is forecasted to be 70% of normal runoff. As always, we ask that you plan to continue to use the secondary water wisely so that we can meet demands, and we can have sufficient water left in storage in the river system for next year.

We continue to encourage efficient use of the water and conserve where possible. Please adjust your watering based on the weather, referencing the state website

(<https://www.conservewater.utah.gov/>). We ask that you water no more than 2 times a week between April - June and September - October, and no more than 3 times a week in July and August (hotter months). We may have to go to more drought restrictions if conditions do not get better.

The State requires meters on all new secondary water services, and we are in the final stages of retrofitting thousands of existing services with meters (for more information, go to <https://utahwatermetering.com/>). We are also in the process of replacing older meter radios with a new type for efficient data collection. We have set up a water user portal, mywaterutah.org, so that water users can see their meter data in an effort to better educate the end user and better manage our limited water resources. Please create an account and link your email address to your property address by sending us an email requesting to do so.

Check our website, www.davisweber.org, for further updates or restrictions. Remember to ensure your system is secure and ready for service prior to us pressurizing the system. We may delay filling the system depending on storms and water availability; often there is no need to water until May.

The fire truck kicks off the fun by sounding off their siren at 9am SHARP, so make sure you're there early. You won't want to miss it!

As always, eggs are hidden with care, separated by age group to keep the fun safe and fair.

This year, parents will not be allowed in the egg hunt with the younger kids. We will have volunteers in those sections to help your little ones get some eggs! We've had a few instances of children almost getting trampled on by those with longer legs than theirs, and we want to avoid that from happening at all this year!

Grab your basket and get ready to hop, skip, and jump into the joy of spring with your neighbors! See you at Central Park for an egg-cellent time!



PUBLIC WORKS POINTERS

After a disaster or emergency, tap water may not be safe to use. Here are a few tips to make your water safe:

- Boil your water for one minute. This method will kill bacteria, viruses, and parasites.
- Add 8 drops or a little less than $\frac{1}{8}$ of a teaspoon of 5%-9% unscented household bleach per 1 gallon of water. This method will kill most viruses and bacteria.
- Choose a water filter labeled to remove parasites, and follow the manufacturer's instructions. Filtered water might need additional treatment to be safe!

As of now, there is no emergency or disaster to be wary of, but it's always good to be prepared in case something arises!

SPRING CLEAN UP

We are getting ready for Spring which means it's officially time for our annual Spring Clean Up! This year, it will take place on Saturday, April 18th from 8am - 2pm at Canyon Meadows Park.

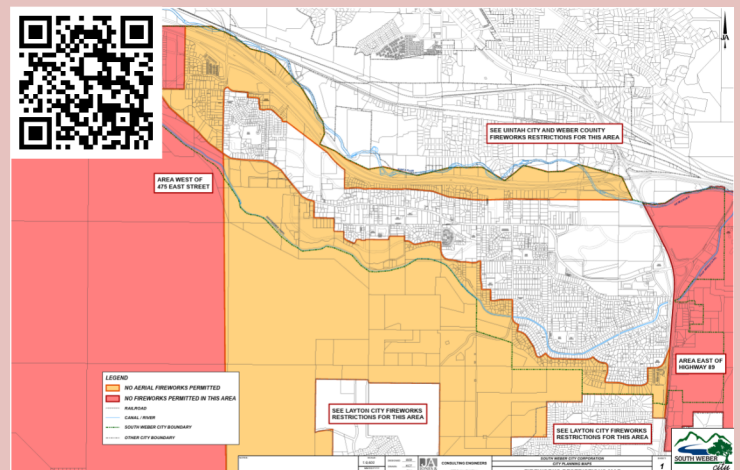
Feel free to come at any point during that time frame to drop off your green waste. Below is a list of items that will not be accepted:

- No large root balls or tree stumps (this is the only green waste not accepted.)
- No mattresses, refrigerators, or tires.
- No hazardous materials like paint, gas, and oil.
- No batteries (especially rechargeable batteries or battery packs)
- No cars, boats, or other large motorized items.

This is a great time to take advantage of these large dumpsters to help you get your yard cleaned up and ready to go for warmer weather! We'll see you there!

HOUSE NUMBERS

Clear and visible house numbers are crucial for efficient emergency response by the fire department. To ensure your house numbers are easy to spot:

- Use large, bold numbers that contrast with the background for optimal visibility.
- Consider installing reflective or illuminated numbers for enhanced visibility, especially at night.
- Regularly maintain and clean the numbers to prevent obstruction and maintain visibility.
- Position numbers near your front door and ensure they are unobstructed from the street view.

By following these simple guidelines, you contribute to a safer and more efficient emergency response in your community.



SPRING CODES TO REMEMBER

Spring is finally here (although we didn't really have much of a winter...)! As we celebrate the warm weather and the smell of flowers and rain, we'd like to remind you of two very important city regulations.

Trailers cannot be parked on the street for more than 48 hours at a time in one location.

Any weeds over 6' high need to be cut down and removed to prevent fire hazards.

By following these codes, you can be a good neighbor and avoid any citations!

Just like last year, we have rented a couple of bounce houses for your kiddos. We will have lots of lawn games and chalk as well, so this will be an event perfect for the whole family!

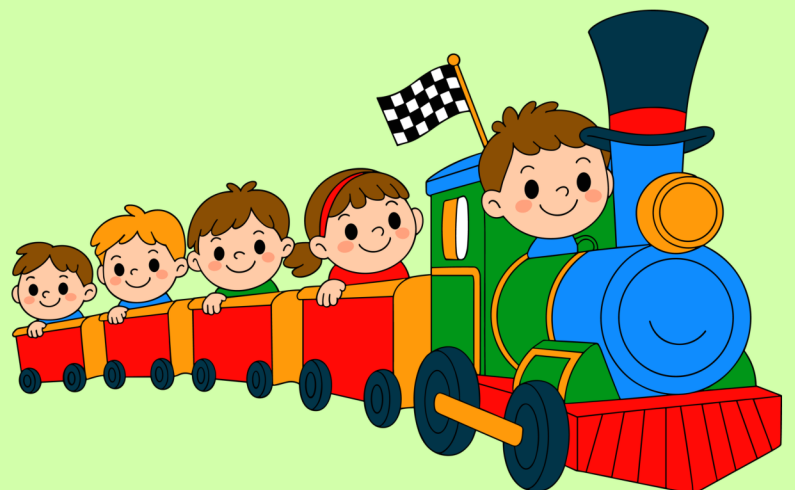
