## Mayor's Message

I would like to take a few minutes and talk to you about the new recycling program we are about to embark on as a city. I want you all to know that as much as anyone, I don't like change. I'm a person that gets in a routine and I don't like to change. Over the years it's become very routine to throw the garbage in the trash can and take it out to the street and think no more about it. Now I'm being asked to separate certain trash items that can be recycled. That's messing with my routine.

I remember when I was young that to get rid of your trash, you would take it out back, throw it in a burn barrel, and light it on fire. When residents in the city were told that a new service was coming to town that would haul garbage to the landfill, the general thought was, "Why would you do that when I can just burn it? Why mess with my routine?" Can you imagine what our city would be like if everyone had a burn barrel behind their house? Just imagine what the city would smell like, and how bad the air quality would be.

It's long overdue that we realize that a recycling program is needed in our city. Our district has asked each city to begin a recycling program to help bring down the cost of disposing trash in our county, and to prolong the life of our landfill. We need to realize that we do have a responsibility in doing what we can to minimize the effect of our trash on others around us and the world we live in. If the cities will get behind this program, we have been told that it will extend the life of the landfill by 15 years, perhaps more. When the landfill is full, it will become a transfer station and it will be very costly to everyone in the district. Recycling now and diverting as much waste as possible not only prolongs the life of the landfill, but reduces the cost of transferring waste.

I know it's going to mess with our routine, but it's what is needed. I hope you will get behind the program and support it.

## Know Before You Glow

Before lighting fireworks this summer, make sure you know which areas are restricted and what those restrictions actually mean!

In South Weber, some neighborhoods or fields have a full firework ban, while others only restrict aerial fireworks due to proximity to dry fields, foothills, and open space.

On this note, the Fire Department has notified us that the most phone calls they get during firework season are for garbage fires, due to used fireworks not being fully cooled down before being thrown away. Please make sure to check that they are cool to the touch before tossing them!

To stay safe, check the official restriction map before you celebrate!

## Summer Heat = Higher Fire Risk

South Weber's beautiful dry summers come with a dangerous downside: increased fire hazards. With high temperatures, low humidity, and dry vegetation, it doesn't take much to spark a serious fire.

Here's how you can help protect your home and neighborhood!

- Keep dry grass and weeds trimmed.
- Don't park vehicles on dry grass.
- Store firewood and flammable materials away from your home.
- Use caution with grills, fire pits, and outdoor tools that spark.
- Report illegal or suspicious burning immediately.

We all play a role in fire prevention. Stay alert and take simple steps to reduce fire risk during Utah's hottest months!



## Back to School Safety Reminders

As we get ready for the upcoming school year, it's time to refocus on safety in school zones! Whether you're dropping off kids or just driving through, we all share responsibility for protecting students and crossing guards.

- Slow Down: The speed limit in school zones is 20 mph when lights are flashing.
- Stop for crossing guards: Even if students aren't in the crosswalk, wait until guards are safely back on the sidewalk.
- Put the phone down: Stay alert and distraction free near schools.

South Weber's crossing guards are out rain or shine, helping keep kids safe every day. Let's return the favor with patient courteous driving!

## Keep Parks Safe and Green

South Weber's parks are meant for picnics, playgrounds, and peaceful afternoons. It is not for engines and tire tracks.

We're seeing an increase in unauthorized motorized vehicle use in city parks, including 4-wheelers, dirt bikes, and side-by-sides. This activity is not allowed and causes serious damage to grass, irrigation systems, and shared spaces.

## Water Wisely

Even with a few spring storms behind us, South Weber is still facing water concerns. Conserving water isn't just a seasonal suggestion, it's something we all need to prioritize to help maintain supply and manage costs.

The easiest place to start is your yard. Make sure to follow all guidelines from your secondary water provider on what days you should be watering, and remember that watering in the heat of the day, between 10 am and 6 pm, means much of it just evaporates before it can even soak in. A few small changes to your sprinkler schedule can make a big impact.

It's also a good time to check your system for broken heads or overspray, and to consider switching out some high-water-use plants for more drought-tolerant options! Every drop we save helps, whether it's skipping a hose-down of the driveway or adjusting your timer after a rainstorm!

## Stormwater Starts at Home

Every time it rains, snows, or even when we water our lawns, the runoff that flows into storm drains doesn't get cleaned or filtered, it flows straight into our creeks, wetlands, and ultimately the Great Salt Lake.

As that water moves across pavement and lawns, it picks up pollutants like grass clippings, fertilizers, oil, and debris. These materials can clog drains and damage local ecosystems.

Here's how you can help:

- Keep grass clippings, leaves and yard waste off sidewalks and out of gutters.
- Sweep up dirt and mulch instead of hosing it into the street.
- Mow high to encourage deep roots and reduce weeds naturally.
- Cover bare soil with mulch or plants to prevent erosion.
- Use fertilizers and chemicals carefully, and never before a storm.

By small changes to our lawn care habits, we can make a big difference in protecting our waterways.

## We're Rolling into Recycling!!

We're so excited to officially launch South Weber's new recycling program! This is a big step forward in helping our community reduce waste and take better care of our environment one blue bin at a time.

By participating, you're helping divert recyclable materials from the landfill and keeping our city cleaner and greener. It's a win for your home, your neighborhood, and the planet.

Recycling will be picked up every other week on your regular garbage days. First pick up will happen the week of June 30!

## Keep South Weber Looking Sharp!

We all love South Weber for its clean streets and beautiful neighborhoods, but that only happens when we all pitch in!

With the summer growing season in full swing, we want to remind residents to stay on top of weeds. Especially along property lines, fence lines, sidewalks, gutters, and park strips. Overgrown weeds not only make it harder to maintain public spaces, but they also pose fire risks and can impact stormwater drainage.

Please take a few minutes each week to check your yard and remove weeds before they spread. Keeping up on yard care helps keep the whole city looking well-maintained and prevents potential code enforcement notices down the road!

## Track My Ballot

State law requires the Lieutenant Governor's Office to provide an optional service for voters to sign up to receive status reports on their ballot 20A-3a-401.5. Track my ballot updates are based on the process checkpoints using postal barcodes. These checkpoints are when the ballot is mailed out by the county clerk and when the ballot is received back at the county office. Voters are encouraged to sign up for this free service by visiting <https://trackmyballot.utah.gov/voter/>

## Utility Rate Changes

Starting in the bills due in August, residents will notice an increase in utility rates for storm drain, sewer, and garbage service. These updates help the city keep up with rising costs and maintain essential infrastructure.

- **Storm Drain** is increasing from \$16.71 to \$17.21
- **Sewer** is increasing from \$22.71 to \$23.62

The adjustment to sewer rates comes in response to Central Weber Sewer District raising their regional service rates.

Garbage rate adjustments are also going into effect during this time. You can find those details on our Garbage and Recycling page, along with everything you need to know about the city's new recycling program.



## Trailer Parking

As a reminder, trailers are not allowed to be parked in the same spot on the street for more than 24 hours. This rule helps keep our streets clear, safe, and accessible for all residents and emergency vehicles. Please remember that moving a trailer within a half-mile of its previous parking location does not reset the 24-hour clock. In other words, simply shifting your trailer to a neighbor's house across the street or a few doors down may still result in a citation if it's within the same 24-hour period.

We know it's not always easy to find trailer storage options, but we appreciate your efforts to follow these guidelines. Keeping our streets safe and uncluttered takes teamwork, and your cooperation makes a big difference!
