## Utility Fee Updates

South Weber residents will see a few utility fee adjustments beginning July 1, 2026, due to increases from our service providers.

### Sewer Service

The Central Weber Sewer Improvement District (CWSID) has increased its sewer treatment fees by approximately 7% effective July 1, 2026. These charges have always been a direct pass-through cost from CWSID to customers.

At this time, South Weber City will not be increasing the City's sewer fee. The City will continue to absorb the increase rather than pass it on to residents.

### Sanitation Service

Wasatch Integrated Waste Management has increased its landfill disposal fee by \$1 effective July 1st.

Customers enrolled in the Basic Bundle program (one garbage can and one recycling can) will not see a rate increase. The Basic Bundle is a separate service program, and its rates are not affected by the landfill fee adjustment.

Customers enrolled in the garbage-only service program will see a \$1 increase per black garbage can. This adjustment reflects the increased landfill disposal fee charged by Wasatch Integrated Waste Management.

## Fire Department Safety Message

As we head into another hot Utah summer, the South Weber City Fire Department would like to remind everyone that warmer temperatures, dry vegetation, and increased outdoor activities can quickly create dangerous fire conditions.

### Wildfire & Grass Fire Prevention

South Weber and the surrounding Wasatch Front are especially vulnerable to fast-moving grass and brush fires during the summer months.

Please help **reduce the risk** by:

- Keeping grass mowed and weeds trimmed.
- Removing dead vegetation and debris around your home.
- Avoiding parking vehicles on dry grass.
- Using caution when operating lawn mowers, weed trimmers, and other equipment that may create sparks.
- Properly disposing of smoking materials.
- Never leaving campfires or recreational fires unattended.

### Defensible Space Saves Homes

Create a defensible space around your property by:

- Keeping a minimum of 5 feet around structures free of combustible materials.
- Trimming tree branches away from roofs and chimneys.
- Moving firewood piles away from buildings.
- Cleaning leaves and debris from gutters.

### Heat Safety

Summer heat can be dangerous for people and pets.

- Stay hydrated and drink water frequently.
- Limit strenuous outdoor activities during the hottest part of the day.
- Check on elderly neighbors and family members.
- Never leave children or pets unattended in a vehicle, even for a few minutes.

### Firework Safety

A reminder as we head into Independence Day and our nation's 250 year celebration:

- Follow all local regulations and restrictions.
- Use fireworks only in approved locations.
- Keep a water source nearby.
- Never allow young children to handle fireworks.
- Dispose of used fireworks by soaking them in abundant amounts of water before discarding.

Your actions can help prevent fires and keep our community safe. Together we can make Summer 2026 a safe and enjoyable season for everyone in South Weber.

## Public Hearing Scheduled for Proposed Property Tax Increase

South Weber City will hold a public hearing regarding a proposed 3% property tax rate increase during the City Council meeting on Tuesday, August 11, 2026 at 6 pm.

The purpose of the public hearing is to provide residents with an opportunity to learn about the proposed increase and share comments with the City Council before any final decision is made.
