

From midnight to noon, now through March 31<sup>st</sup>, there shall be no on-street parking. This ensures our snow plows can efficiently clear roads and minimizes icy conditions, reducing the risk of accidents. Please find alternative parking arrangements during restricted hours to keep our streets accessible.



## Christmas Tree Pick Up

It's time to bid adieu to your festive fir! Robinson Waste will be on the prowl for Christmas trees on Wednesday, January 7th. Here are the guidelines:

- Place trees near the sidewalk
- Remove tree stands
- Crews will not pick up trees taller than 8 feet, so if necessary, cut trees in half.
- If there is snow, please keep your trees on top of the snow so crews can spot them easily.
- No flocked trees.
- Remove all decorations and lights.
- Trees cannot be tied, wrapped, or put into tree bags.

Please keep in mind that crews come pretty early in the morning, so have your tree ready to go and on the curb as soon as possible!

## Snow Removal

Winter is in full gear and our Public Works drivers are hard at work making sure our Snow Plows are ready to go for those snowy days. To ensure a seamless and safe experience for everyone, here are a few important reminders:

**Trim Back Branches:** Before the snowfall accumulates, take a moment to trim back branches along the roadside. This prevents collisions with our snow plows.

**Keep Roads Clear:** Avoid parking on the streets during snowfall, enabling our plows to navigate smoothly and effectively. Your cooperation ensures a faster and more thorough job in clearing the snow.

## Annual Easter Egg Hunt




